How to Convert Propane Grill WeberQ 1000, 1200, 100 or 120 for Quick Connect to regulated RV on-board propane and still retain disposable small bottle propane option. Cost about \$30

Steps:

- Remove regulator by unscrewing the regulator from the Weber Q.
 You should end up with an exposed 1/8" MNPT (a male threaded piece poking out from behind the Weber's control knob).
- Screw/attach the Watts LFA-706 to the Weber 1/8 MNPT that's sticking out.
- 3) Screw attach the Model 250 1/8" MNPT end of the Male Plug to the other end of the LFA-706
- Your RV's propane hose should now just quick connect attach to the Male Plug.
- 5) RETAIN OPTION: Screw/insert the Model 250 1/8" MNPT end of the Quick Connect into the regulator you just removed from the Weber Q. If you want to make your Weber portable again, just push the Quick Connect end onto that new Male Plug you just installed.

Final note. Please use either 'pipe dope for gas lines' or 'loc-tite thread sealant for gas lines' on your connections to avoid leaks. LA-CO Slic-Tite PTFE looks to be a good choice. Be sure to check for leaks after you finish.
